Position Summary

At Waxwing Wellness, we are grounded in the belief that healing happens in relationship to ourselves, to each other, and to our environment. We're looking for a full-time Licensed Psychotherapist who will embody this relational and values-driven approach. This role is designed for a clinician seeking a sustainable, supported, and connected practice.

Clinicians complete a minimum of 600 clinical sessions per year, averaging 150 sessions per quarter, 12 sessions per week. Our practice culture values authenticity, community care, and integrity, and we are committed to helping clinicians do their best work while preserving wellbeing.

Essential Functions & Responsibilities

- Provide high-quality, trauma-informed psychotherapy to individuals, couples, and/or families (depending on licensure and areas of expertise).
- Maintain a consistent caseload of 12 sessions per week, averaged quarterly. (600 clinical sessions per year minimum).
- Complete clinical documentation and progress notes within 24 hours of the session.
- Engage in productive collaboration with client collaterals regarding client care (paid additionally up to 30 minutes per week).
- Participate in bi-weekly team meetings (paid).
- Participate in quarterly meetings with Waxwing Wellness leadership to review responsibilities, exchange feedback, and support mutual accountability (paid).
- Engage in regular clinical consultation and professional development.
- Communicate clearly and compassionately with clients, staff, and leadership.
- Uphold Waxwing Wellness's standards of care, ethics, and inclusivity.
- Abide by all HIPAA and licensing regulations.
- Contribute to a collaborative and values-aligned team environment.

Skills, Abilities & Experience

Required:

- Active, unrestricted license to practice psychotherapy in Pennsylvania (LCSW, LPC, LMFT, or PsyD/PhD).
- Strong commitment to trauma-informed, client-centered care.
- Comfort and competence working with diverse populations and identities.
- Ability to work independently while staying connected to a collaborative team.

Preferred:

- Specialized training or interest in emotion-focused therapy, trauma therapy, or working with specific populations (e.g. LGBTQIA+, BIPOC, perinatal mental health, Child/Adolescent, etc.).
 - Experience working within a group practice or community-based setting.
 - Desire for in-person work.

Working Conditions & Physical Requirements

- Ability to work from a secure and private home office, as well as attend in-person sessions as needed.
- Must be able to attend required meetings and participate in team events either remotely or in-person.

Pay

In addition to a starting **50% revenue split** (with opportunity for annual increases up to 53%), Waxwing Wellness invests in each clinician through employer-funded benefits and support, including, retirement contributions, CEU funding, paid meetings, consultation, and payroll tax contributions. Collectively, these benefits bring Waxwing's total employer investment to approximately **56.7% of generated revenue**. Benefits

Retirement: 401K with a 3% employer non-elective contribution after a 6-month eligibility period. Two-year vesting schedule applies.

Professional Development and Support:

- \$100/year CEU scholarship after a 90-day eligibility period (Does not roll over to the following year).
- Bi-weekly team meetings (paid at \$15/hr).

Consultation: CEO, or other Waxwing Wellness Leadership to provide individual clinical consultation upon request.

Unlimited Unpaid Time Off (UTO) upon supervisor approval:

Clinicians may take unlimited unpaid time off provided that:

- All appropriate measures are taken to meet ethical guidelines related to abandonment and continuity of care
 - Appropriate notice is given and Leadership approves
 - Quarterly clinical hour expectations, as outlined in the clinician's job description, are maintained
